


Question– Could our family come and take us out for the day ?

Dear Friends,

I have been receiving a lot of questions about quarantine and what are the rules around leaving.

First, I would like to say that you all have been wonderfully tolerant and accepting of the limitations this pandemic with Covid-19 has caused us. As you know, your safety and the safety of our staff are of utmost importance to Home Again and our Cambridge management. Cambridge has remained Covid free and our goal is to continue that trend and with your understanding and help, we shall persevere.

As for leaving the facility, I will start by reminding you that we are unable to tell a resident that they cannot leave our community. It is your right to do so, but that I ask that you wear a mask while in the community (in our community and the community at large) and upon your return you are open and willing to the precautions chosen in attempt to keep you and everyone in the community safe. Where a resident might be going is largely dependent on how we will respond to that leave upon return.

For example, we are fully ware of how doctor offices are responding to covid and what precautions they are taking to prevent community spread of the virus. A hair salon has different requirements and are not uniform in how they are implementing precautions, thus, we may not quarantine the resident who attends a doctor office but may do so if a resident is out to a salon. Family homes are not regulated so this poses another level of risk.

Factors that we take into effect when deciding on how to an outing include but are not limited to:

How much risk was involved in the outing? How many people were encountered?

What precautions did the place of visit implement and how sure are we or can we be that they are following the routine with those safety measures?

Was social distancing followed and were masks worn and worn appropriately and effectively?

Possible responses to the return to Home Again:

Resident may be placed on quarantine until a covid test can be given and results are obtained

The resident may be required to have 2 negative covid tests prior to lifting quarantine protocol.

Resident may be asked to wear a mask in the Home Again Community and schedule for covid testing when staff are next scheduled for testing.

The best course of action is to talk to management about an outing to discuss the risk level and the response needed for that outing.

I do thank you for your understanding of these policies and new protocol. This is certainly a time of uncertainty that is unprecedented in our lives and we are working non-stop to learn and implement the best safety measures to keep us all safe. I am aware that it is difficult for everyone and so limiting. You can always reach out to staff and request additional 1:1 time or discuss and seek support for feelings of isolation, depression, boredom. We are here to support you and to help you find ways to increase your well-being or to improve your current quality of life. Now more than ever, this is important to share and seek support for.

Question- Will we be given Flu shots as a community or will we have to go to our own Dr's office?




Answer– Everyone will have the opportunity to have their flu shot here at Home Again. We will give out more information when we receive dates and times.
